

LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH
PROVISION OF A FREE LIMITED TIME DISABLED
PERSONS' PARKING PLACE IN LOWER MARSH

(Note: This Notice is about the provision of a new free limited time disabled persons' parking place in Lower Marsh.)

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 15th May 2019 made The Lambeth (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons') (Limited Time) (No. 1) Order 2019, under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 24th May 2019.

2. In brief, the general effect of the Order will be to provide a disabled persons parking place in that length of Lower Marsh which lies on the south side, 8.2 metres west of Baylis Road for a distance of 6.6 metres.

3. The disabled persons' parking place will operate at any time and will be available for use only by vehicles which display in the relevant position a valid disabled persons' blue badge issued by a local authority for periods of not more than 30 minutes, vehicles will not be able to return to the disabled persons' parking place within 1 hour of leaving it.

4. The Order is necessary to improve parking facilities for people with disabilities and to assist in regulating parking.

A copy of the Order and documents giving detailed particulars about it (including a map) are available for inspection between 9.30 am and 4.30 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive (except on bank/public holidays), until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Order is made, at: the offices of Lambeth Council's Highways and Enforcement Group (Environment and Growth), 3rd Floor, Civic Centre, 6 Brixton Hill, London SW2 1EG. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
