## LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH PROPOSED ZEBRA PEDESTRIAN CROSSING IN ROOKERY ROAD [NOTE: This Notice is about a proposal to provide a new

zebra pedestrian crossing in Rookery Road. Comments

are invited - see paragraph 5.] 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth proposes, under section 23

of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, to provide a new zebra pedestrian crossing in that length of Rookery Road

which lies between Long Road (A3) and Clapham Common South Side (A24), adjacent to the paths across the common that extend from Long Road to Windmill Drive Zig-zag markings (on which vehicles are banned from stopping at any time) would be placed on the carriageway either side of the crossing.

2. The proposed zebra pedestrian crossing is necessary

because of an anticipated increase in the number of pedestrians using Clapham Common and crossing Rookery Road, which is part of Cycleway 5. Lambeth's Cycleway 5 route is being upgraded at various locations, as part of the council's emergency Covid-19 transport response programme. The overall aims of the programme are to; reduce road danger and help residents to socially distance safely, boost safe and sustainable transport to support the borough's economic recovery, and improve air quality. The new crossing will improve safety for pedestrians by providing a new crossing in line with
