

CLAPHAM COMMON

Putt in the Park Ltd has applied to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for consent under S.38 of the Government Act 2006/section 23(2) of the National Trust Act 1971/ article 12 of the Greater London Parks and Open spaces Order 1967* to carry out restricted works on Clapham Common. The planning inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The proposed works are: To create two landscaped putting greens covering an area of 3400 sq m replacing two bowling greens. Within this area there will be 1070 sq m of borders planted with 100% Bee friendly shrubs, trees, wild flowers and 100m² water feature. To erect 3400m of low level post rope and netting around perimeter of courses. Posts 1.2m high with two 30mm ropes split 40cm apart with netting below lower rope to ground. Scrape turf and topsoil to 100mm and grade areas according to plans, all turf and topsoil to be reused on site for new borders. Crushed stone with artificial grass to create putting greens. Brick block paving for internal paths and terrace, all paving and artificial turf is permeable. Wildflower borders inside post and rope fencing to encourage bees and insects plus camouflaging the fencing. Water feature with 20cm depth.

The works/fencing will be located on the two Bowling Greens next door to the Pavilion on Clapham Common Westside.

Also in the application is the toilet block, planning permission 2020/0620, which will replace the disused sea container.
