### LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF "AT ANY TIME" WAITING RESTRICTIONS

### (DOUBLE YELLOW LINES) IN GREENHURST ROAD AND LAMBERHURST ROAD [NOTE: This Notice is about proposals to introduce a ban on waiting by vehicles "at any

time" in parts of Greenhurst Road and Lamberhurst Road, at and near the junction of those two roads, to discourage parking near to that road junction. Objections or other comments may be made - see paragraph 6.1

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth proposes to make the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. -) Order 202-, under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984
- 2. The general effect of the Order would be to ban waiting by vehicles at any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Notice (this would be indicated on the road by double yellow lines). 3. The Order is necessary because the junction of Greenhurst Road and Lamberhurst Road was recently tightened to encourage lower vehicle speeds through the junction and
- improve safety and accessibility for pedestrians by improving sight lines and the informal
- pedestrian crossing facility. Reducing the carriageway has meant that waiting restrictions need to be implemented at the junction to protect pedestrian - driver sight lines by eliminating the ability for drivers of vehicles to park on the junction. 4.
