## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14 TEMPORARY PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICULAR TRAFFIC AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS -SOUTHVILLE

LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, to allow footway and carriageway maintenance and improvement works to the entrance to Larkhall Park to be carried out safely, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth have made an

Order the effect of which will be to temporarily ban pedestrians and vehicles from entering or parking and waiting (including waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading a vehicle) in Southville. 2. The ban on pedestrians entering Southville or Larkhall

Park via Southville and the ban on vehicles entering or waiting in Southville will only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by the placing of the appropriate traffic signs and will not apply to any person or vehicle requiring access to or egress from a property in Southville accessible only from Southville. 3. An alternative route for pedestrians and cyclists

requiring access to Larkhall Park will be available via Wandsworth Road and Courland Street and vice versa. 4. An alternative route for motor vehicles is not applicable as Southville is a no through road. 5. The Order will come into force on 31st January 2022 and will continue for 3 months, or until the works have been

completed whichever is the sooner. In practice it is anticipated that the Order will only have effect from 31st January 2022 for approximately 6 weeks, but if the works cannot be carried out or completed during that time, then the Order may have effect at other times within the maximum duration of 3 months.
