ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14
TEMPORARY TRAFFIC AND PARKING
RESTRICTIONS FOR TELECOMMUNICATION WORKS
BALDRY GARDENS, BRAXTED PARK AND
HEYBRIDGE AVENUE

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, to enable telecommunications repair and maintenance works to be carried out, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, have made an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily ban vehicles from entering or waiting (including waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) in that length of: -

- (a) **Baldry Gardens**, which lies between Copley Park and a point 20 metres south-west of Copley Park (an alternative route for affected vehicles will be available via Copley Park, Heybridge Avenue and Braxted Park and vice versa).
- (b) **Braxted Park**, which lies between Heybridge Avenue and a point 14 metres north-west of Heybridge Avenue (an alternative route for affected vehicles will be available via Heybridge Avenue, Copley Park and Baldry Gardens and vice versa).
- (c) **Heybridge Avenue**, which lies between Copley Park and a point 25 metres south-west of Copley Park (an alternative route for affected vehicles will be available via Copley Park, Baldry Gardens and Braxted Park and vice versa).

2. The road closures and ban on waiting and loading will only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by the placing of the appropriate traffic signs.

3. The Order will come into force on 16th March 2022 and will continue for a maximum duration of 6 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the sooner. It is anticipated that the works will be carried out in 3 phases as follows – (a) Phase 1: Braxted Park – 16th March 2022 for a period of 1 day; (b) Phase 2: Baldry Gardens – 17th March 2022 for a period of 1 day; and (c) Phase 3: Heybridge Avenue – 18th March 2022 for a period of 1 day. If the works cannot be carried out or completed during this time, then the Order may have effect on subsequent dates within the maximum period of 6 months.
