

## LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH

### LOWER MARSH – PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONE

*[NOTE: This Notice is about the introduction of a pedestrian and cycle zone in Lower Marsh. A section of the one way working in Frazier Street will be revoked].*

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 27th April 2022 made the Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 5) Traffic Order 2022, under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Order will come into force on 30th April 2022.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to:-

(a) in **Lower Marsh** introduce a pedestrian and cycle zone, that would operate on Monday to Friday between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. and 4.45 p.m. and 9 p.m.:

(i) between the common boundary of Nos. 80/81 and 82 Lower Marsh and the north-eastern kerb-lines of Launcelot Street / Frazier Street; and

(ii) between the south-western kerb-lines of Launcelot Street / Frazier Street and a point opposite the north-eastern flank wall of No. 140 Lower Marsh; and

(b) in **Frazier Street**, revoke a section of one way working, between the south-eastern boundary of No. 27 Lower Marsh and the north-western kerb-line of Murphy Street, so that traffic would be able to travel two ways in this section.

3. The Order is necessary to make permanent the temporary measures implemented in August 2020, which created a pedestrian and cycle zone in Lower Marsh to create the necessary space to facilitate outdoor seating and trading. The proposal in Frazier Street accommodates access and facilitates loading. The continuation of these measures creates a better walking and cycling route, promoting the Council's Healthy Route network.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
