NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 14th September made the Lambeth (Brixton "E") (Parking Places) (No. 5) Order 2022, the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 323) Order 2022 and the Lambeth (Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools) (Amendment No. 2) Order 2022, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation
- The general effect of the Orders will be on:-(a) the south side to:

Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 20th September 2022.

 - (i) remove the school keep clear marking in Mandrell Road opposite Nos. 18 to 28
 Mandrell Road and extend the existing adjacent residents' parking space by
 25.56 metres;
 (ii) reduce a length of shared use pay by phone, residents' and business parking
 - space and adjacent residents' only parking at the side of No. 4 Ashby Mews and opposite Nos. 2 to 8 Mandrell Road and install a new school keep clear marking and single yellow line which will operate outside the hours of the school keep clear marking in that length of road instead;
- (b) the north side to:
 - remove a length of residents' parking place outside Nos. 2 to 18 Mandrell Road and replace it with a single yellow line which will operate during zone hours at this location instead; and
- (ii) extend the existing residents' parking place by 25.4 metres in an eastward direction (outside Nos. 18 to 28 Mandrell Road).3. The Orders are necessary to enable the removal of an existing school keep clear
- marking in Mandrell Road which is no longer required and the extension of the adjacent residents' parking space. Changes to other parking places will enable the installation of new school keep clear markings further along Mandrell Road, the construction of a new dropped kerb so as to allow access to the newly renovated and developed school site and the installation of a single yellow line to prevent parking that might otherwise cause an obstruction.
