PROVISION OF A LOADING PLACE AND INTRODUCTION OF A LENGTH OF SINGLE YELLOW LINE IN PALACE ROAD

[NOTE: This notice is about the provision of a new loading place and the introduction of a length of single yellow line adjacent to the loading place which would operate between the hours specified below in Palace Road. Objections or other comments may be made – see paragraph 6.]

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 7th September 2022 made the Lambeth (Loading Place) (No. 4) Order 2022 and the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 322) Order 2022 under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 12th September 2022.
2. The general effect of the Orders will be to:-
 - (a) provide a new loading place on the north-east side of Palace Road opposite the Palace Road Nature Garden, 15.8 metres south-east of Coburg Crescent (the loading place will be 15.1 metres long, it will operate every day between 7 am and 6 pm for periods of up to 20 minutes with no return to the loading place within 1 hour, only vehicles that are being continually loaded or unloaded will be permitted to use the loading place); and
 - (b) introduce a length of single yellow line in that length of Palace Road which lies on the northeast side (adjacent to the new loading place) between a point 30.9 metres south-east of Coburg Crescent and a point 50.9 metres south-east of Coburg Crescent which will operate between 7 am and 7 pm Monday to Fridays inclusive.
3. The Orders are necessary to provide loading and unloading facilities for vehicles making deliveries to or collections from nearby properties and premises.

6. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
