THE A23 GLA ROAD (BRIGHTON ROAD, LONDON BOROUGH OF CROYDON) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC AND STOPPING) ORDER 2022

STOPPING) ORDER 2022

- I. Transport for London in consultation with the London Borough of Croydon hereby gives notice that it has made the above named Traffic Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose specified in paragraph 2. The effect of the Order is summarised in paragraph 3.
- 2. The purpose of the Order is to enable highway improvement and resurfacing works to take place on the A23 Brighton Road.

3. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any vehicle from:

- entering, exiting or proceeding on A23 Brighton Road southbound between its junction with the roundabout at A237 Brighton Road/A23 Farthing Way and a point 200 metres south of its junction with Woodplace Lane;
 - (2) stopping on Brighton Road between its junction with the roundabout at A237 Brighton Road/A23 Farthing Way and a point 200 metres
 - at A237 Brighton Road/A23 Farthing Way and a point 200 metres south of its junction with Woodplace Lane;

 (3) entering or proceeding on Hollymeoak Road north-eastbound
 - between its junctions with Starrock Road and Brighton Road;
 (4) entering or proceeding on Woodplace Lane westbound between its junctions with Woodplace Class and Brighton Road;
 - junctions with Woodplace Close and Brighton Road; Works will be phased such that some restrictions will apply only at
 - certain times.

 The Order will be effective at certain times between 16th September 2022 and 12th March 2023, every night 9:00 PM until 5:00 AM or when the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. The prohibitions will apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
- 4. The prohibitions will not apply in respect of:
 - (I) any vehicle being used for the purposes of those works or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (2) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by Transport for London.
- At such times as the prohibitions are in force alternative routes will be indicated by traffic signs via Farthing Way, Brighton Road, Purley Road, Godstone Road, Caterham Bypass, Godstone Hill, M25 westbound and
