ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A3200 GLA ROAD (SOUTHWARK STREET) AND A3 GLA ROAD (BOROUGH HIGH STREET, LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC AND STOPPING) ORDER 2022

1. Transport for London in consultation with the London Borough of Southwark hereby gives notice that it has made the above named Traffic Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose specified in paragraph 2. The effect of the Order is summarised in paragraph 3.
2. The purpose of the Order is to enable highway improvement and signals works to take place on the A3200 Southwark Street and A3 Borough High Street.
3. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any vehicle from:
 - (1) stopping on Southwark Street between its junctions with Red Cross Way and Borough High Street;
 - (2) stopping on the southern kerb line of St Thomas Street between its junctions with Borough High Street and Joiner Street;
 - (3) stopping on Borough High Street between its junctions with London Bridge Street and Talbot Yard;
 - (4) entering or exiting Kings Head Yard at its junction with Borough High Street;
 - (5) stopping in the temporary taxi bay on the southern kerb of Southwark Street between a point 1.2 metres west of the Southwark Street Cycle Hire Bay to a point 9.6 metres eastwards. The bay will operate 'No stopping at any time, except taxis at authorised times.

This Order will also:

Allow a one way operation to operate entering via Kings Head Yard and exiting via White Hart Yard when provision 3(4) is not in force.

The Order will be effective at certain times between 8:00 AM on the 9th January 2023 and 7:00 PM on the 9th June 2023 or when the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. Provision 3(4) will be in operation between 8.00 AM on 25th January 2023 until 7:00 PM on 1st February 2023.

The prohibitions will apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

4. The prohibitions will not apply in respect of:
 - (1) any vehicle being used for the purposes of those works or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (2) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by Transport for London.
