

LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH
SCHOOL STREETS SCHEME – VARIOUS ROADS
ROAD CLOSURES AND PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONE

(NOTE: This notice is about continuing indefinitely the closure of Hanover Gardens, Etherstone Road, Etherstone Green, Springwell Road, Springwell Close, Elmcourt Road, Maley Avenue, Sunnyhill Road and Harborough Road to all motor vehicles except permit holders at certain times of the day, by making permanent the experimental pedestrian and cycle zones in those roads. The road closures and pedestrian and cycle zones will continue to operate in those roads at the times specified in this notice on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. It is anticipated that they will only operate during those hours in school term-time.)

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth ('the Council'), on 26th April 2023 made the Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 3) Traffic Order 2023 under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 2nd May 2023.
2. The general effect of the Order will be to continue to ban motor vehicles, except for permit holders from entering:-
 - (a) the length of **Hanover Gardens** from its junction with Elias Place in a westerly direction between the hours of 8.30am to 9.30am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (b) the length of **Etherstone Road** between Leigham Court Road and Springwell Road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.15am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (c) the length of **Etherstone Green** from Etherstone Road along its entire length between the hours of 8.15am to 9.15am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (d) the length of **Springwell Close** at its junction with Etherstone Road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.15am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (e) the length of **Springwell Road** between Valleyfield Road and Etherstone Road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.15am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (f) the length of **Elmcourt Road** between Thurlow Park Road and Norwood road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.30am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (g) the length of **Maley Avenue** between Avenue Park Road and Elmcourt Road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.30am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (h) the length of **Sunnyhill Road** between Angles Road and Valley Road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.15am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays;
 - (i) the length of **Harborough Road** between Valley Road and Sunnyhill Road between the hours of 8.15am to 9.15am and 3pm to 4pm Monday to Fridays.
3. Permits allowing vehicles to enter each pedestrian and cycle zone will be available to residents and employees of businesses and organisations at premises located within or accessible only from that pedestrian and cycle zone, and to disabled person's badge holders who fall into the above criteria and have a bona fide reason to enter that pedestrian and cycle zone, by application to the Council.
4. The pedestrian and cycle zones in paragraph 2 will only operate during these hours in school term-time when the traffic signs are showing. Any vehicle that is already in those length of roads listed in paragraph 2 before the pedestrian and cycle zone commences will be permitted to leave.
5. The Order is intended to continue to create a pleasant environment that feels safer in the immediate vicinity of a school or nursery, discourage travelling to school or nursery by car, and encourage walking, scooting and cycling to school, thereby achieving positive healthy outcomes for the school community.

8. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
