LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF BICYCLE PARKING HANGARS IN VARIOUS ROADS ACROSS THE BOROUGH AND REMOVAL OF EXISTING PARKING SPACES TO ACCOMMODATE THOSE HANGARS [NOTE: This Notice is about proposals to introduce secure bicycle parking hangars at each of the locations specified in paragraph 2 below. 2.6 metres of any existing parking space at these locations will be removed to accommodate new parking places in which the hangars would be situated.] 1.
