

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

The Lewisham (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Consolidation) (Amendment No 4) Order 2023

The Lewisham (Charged for Parking Places) (Consolidation) (Amendment No 4) Order 2023

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lewisham Borough Council on 25th August 2023 made the above-mentioned Order under the powers the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Orders will come into force on 25th August 2023:

PTO 1015 The effect of the above orders will be to introduce disable parking bays 6.6m long and 2.0 m wide in the following locations.

- a) Etta Street – outside No 86 Etta Street
- b) Billington Road – outside No 62 Billington Road
- c) Hatcham Park Road – across the boundary of Nos 33/35 Hatcham Park Road, removing existing disabled bay outside No 31
- d) Caterham Road – outside No 44 Caterham Road replacing existing resident bay
- e) Crofton Park Road – outside No 137/135 Crofton Park Road replacing existing disabled bay
- f) Glenfarg Road – outside No 66 Glenfarg Road
- g) Verdant Lane – outside No 70 Verdant Lane
- h) King Alfred Avenue – outside No 35 King Alfred Avenue replacing existing resident bay
- i) Knowles Hill Crescent – outside the side of No 156 Courthill Road replacing existing resident bay
- j) Goldsworthy Gardens – outside No 3 Goldsworthy Gardens
- k) Sketchley Gardens – outside No 39 Sketchley Gardens
- l) Avignon Road – outside No 49 Avignon Road replacing existing resident bay
- m) Camden Row – outside No 8/9 Camden Row replacing existing resident bay
- n) Dowanhill Road – outside No 37 Dowanhill Road, removing existing bay outside No 35A
- o) Homecroft Road – outside No 44 Homecroft Road

2. A pack of documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order can be collected for inspection between 9am – 5pm Mondays to Fridays at the office of the London Borough of Lewisham, Laurence House, 1 Catford Road, London SE6 4RU. 3. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
