[NOTE: This Notice is about the Council's proposal to install no waiting at any time restrictions on Lansdowne Hill and no waiting and no loading restrictions and an interpeak (10am-4pm) 20-minute loading bay within the bus

lane on the southwest side of Westminster Bridge Road.

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 27th October 2023 made the Lambeth (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment

No. 28) Order 2023 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act

- 1984 (as amended).

  2. The general effect of the Order will be:-
  - (1) In Lansdowne Hill, install 18 metres of no waiting at any time (double yellow lines) on both sides of Lansdowne Hill westward from the junction of Canterbury Grove;
- Lansdowne Hill westward from the junction of Canterbury Grove;

  (2) In Westminster Bridge Road, the southwest side,(a) install no waiting and no loading at any time in the bus lane; (b) install a 10-metre 20-minute loading bay operating between 10am and 4pm outside 111

Westminster Bridge Road; (c) install no waiting and

- no loading restrictions between 4pm and 10am in the loading bay outside 111 Westminster Bridge Road.
- The proposals are necessary in:

   Lansdowne Hill, to improve visibility and sightlines for vehicles at the junction of Canterbury Grove with Lansdowne Hill and to maintain access to local properties and the rear service road to properties on Norwood Road.

   Westminster Bridge Road, to improve bus journey
- times by the control of parked vehicles within the west bound bus lane and clarify and centralise interpeak loading activity at a single location within the bus lane.
