ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE GLA ROADS AND GLA SIDE ROADS (ROYAL BOROUGH OF KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA AND CITY OF WESTMINSTER) (20 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2023

- I. Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 16 th October 2023 it made the above named Order, under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 23 rd October 2023.
- 2. The general nature and effect of the Order would be to impose a speed limit of 20 MPH speed limit on the A4 Knightsbridge/ Brompton Road/ Thurloe Place/ Cromwell Road and Cromwell Gardens, the A3220 Holland Road, Addison Crescent, Addison Road, Warwick Gardens, Pembroke Road, Earls Court Road, Warwick Road, Finborough Road, Redcliffe Gardens, Gunter Grove, Ashburnham Road, Cremorne Road and Edith Grove and all GLA Side Roads Red Route returns of these roads in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and the A4 Knightsbridge/ Brompton Road and all GLA Side Roads Red Route returns of these roads in City of Westminster. The Order will also consolidate existing 20 MPH schemes on Cheyne Walk, Chelsea Embankment, Cheyne Walk, Battersea Bridge and Earl's Court Road.
- 3. The roads which would be affected by the Order are the GLA Main Roads and all GLA Side Roads Red Route returns of these roads in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and of City of Westminster as listed in article 2 above.
- 4. The roads affected are currently subject to a permanent speed limit of 30 MPH.
