LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH PROPOSED REMOVAL OF PARKING SPACES TO ACCOMMODATE FOOTWAY CROSSOVERS IN DREWSTEAD ROAD, GLENEAGLE ROAD AND WOODBOURNE AVENUE

(NOTE: This Notice is about proposals to remove lengths of parking space and replace them with single yellow line waiting restrictions so as to allow access to and from offstreet parking facilities at certain footway crossovers.

- 1. NOTICE IS GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth made the Lambeth (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 34) Order 2023 the Lambeth (Charged for Parking Places) (Amendment No. 31) Order 2023, under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).
- 2. The general effect of the Orders would be to remove the shared use parking places at each of the following locations and replace them with single yellow line waiting restrictions that would apply during the times that the local Controlled Parking Zone operates in (i) Drewstead Road, the south-west side outside No. 63; (ii) Gleneagle Road, the south-east side (a) outside No. 127; and (b) outside No. 145; and (iii) Woodbourne Avenue, the south side, outside No. 43.

3. The proposed Orders are required to enable access to and from off-street parking facilities at footway crossovers at the locations referred to in paragraph 2 above. 4. A copy of the Orders and other documents giving

5. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
