

# Transport for London Notice

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

### THE GLA ROADS AND GLA SIDE ROADS (LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK) (20 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2023

1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 11th December 2023 it made the above named Order, under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 18th December 2023.
2. The general nature and effect of the Order would be to impose a speed limit of 20 MPH speed limit on all GLA Roads and GLA Side Road extents in the London Borough of Southwark.  
The Order will also consolidate existing 20 MPH schemes on A202 Peckham High Street, A3200 Stamford Street/ Southwark Street, A201 Blackfriars Road, A100 Tower Bridge/ Tower Bridge Road, A302 St George's Road, A201 London Road, A3 Elephant and Castle/ Newington Butts, A202 Camberwell Church Street/ Camberwell New Road, A3 Borough High Street, A2 Great Dover Street, A200 Tooley Street/ St Thomas Street/ Crucifix Lane/ Bermondsey Street, A101 Rotherhithe Tunnel.
3. The roads which would be affected by the Order are GLA Main Roads and all GLA Side Roads - Red Route returns of these roads in the London Borough of Southwark.
4. The roads affected are currently subject to a permanent speed limit of 30 MPH.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers conferred by the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order is made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
