ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A23 GLA ROAD (BRIGHTON ROAD, LONDON BOROUGH OF CROYDON) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2024

1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that it has made the above-named Traffic Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose specified in paragraph 2. The effect of the Order is summarised in paragraph 3.
2. The purpose of the Order is to enable Highways England works to take place on the A23 Brighton Road.
3. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any vehicle from entering, exiting or proceeding on A23 Brighton Road between its junction with the roundabout at A237 Brighton Road/A23 Farthing Way and the administrative boundaries of London Borough of Croydon and Surrey County Council, local access to be maintained.

Works will be phased such that some restrictions will apply only at certain times.

The Order will be effective between 29th January 2024 and 3rd February 2024 each night 10:00 PM to 5:00 AM or when the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. The prohibitions will apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

4. The prohibitions will not apply in respect of:
 - (1) any vehicle being used for the purposes of those works or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (2) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by Transport for London.
5. At such times as the prohibitions are in force alternative routes will be indicated by traffic signs (**Southbound diversion**) via - A22 Caterham By-Pass, A22 Godstone Road, M25 Jct 6 (motorway traffic wishing to access the M23/M25 will then exit here and use the M25 clockwise carriageway to get to the M25/M23). All other traffic that needs to get to the A23 towards Merstham/Redhill will then be diverted via A22 Southbound, A25 Westbound, A25 Godstone Road, A25 Nuffield Road, A23 London Road and A23 Merstham to normal route of travel. (**Northbound diversion**) via Access from the M25/M23 will be shut on these nights so only local traffic can get towards Star Lane but all other traffic trying to access from the A23 London Road/Harps Oak Lane/ Glebe will be pre-diverted. The diversion for local traffic trying to gain access from A23 London Road / Harps Oak Lane/ Glebe will be via A23 Merstham, A23 London Road, A25 Nuffield Road, A25 Godstone Road, A25 Eastbound, A22 Northbound to M25 Jct 6, A22 Godstone Road, A22 Caterham By-Pass, A23 Purely. Motorway traffic trying to access from the M25/M23 will be diverted to M25 Jct 8, M25 Jct 6, A22 Godstone Road, A22 Caterham By-Pass and Purley to normal route of travel.
