LAMBETH) BANNED TURN ORDER 2024 1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 19th July 2024 it made the above named Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic

- Regulation Act 1984. 2. The A205 GLA Road (Cavendish Road, London Borough of Lambeth) Banned Turn Experimental Traffic Order 2023 was made under section 9
- of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and came into force on 3rd February 2023. 3. The general nature and effect of the experimental Order was to prohibit any vehicle except pedal cycles travelling westwards on the A205
- Cavendish Road to turn right into Klea Avenue. 4. Transport for London has carefully considered whether or not the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued indefinitely and has decided that they should be so continued. 5. Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on Local Authorities' by
- section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and in accordance with regulation 23 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996, Transport for London has made the A205 GLA Road (Cavendish Road, London Borough of Lambeth) Banned Turn Order 2024 ("the permanent Order"). That Order will come into force on 1st August 2024, and the effect of that Order will be to continue in force indefinitely the provisions of the experimental Orders. 6. The road affected by the permanent Orders is the GLA road Cavendish
- Road. 7.
