- 2. The general nature and effect of the Orders will be to:

- (I) make administrative changes to the existing No Stopping At Any Time restrictions on A23 Streatham High Road west side between Nos. 202
- and 204 Streatham High Road to No. 148 Streatham High Road; introduce No Stopping At Any Time restrictions on A23 Streatham High Road west side No. 138 Streatham High Road to No. 142 Streatham High Road, to replace the existing Pelican Crossing zig
- zags; (3)relocate the Mon to Sat 7am to 7pm 20 min loading and 3 hour disabled persons' vehicles bay on the western side outside Nos 148 to 156 Streatham High Road to outside of 144 to 146
 - 18.5 metres: (4)remove all Transport for London red route controls on Gracefield Gardens:

Streatham High Road, its length will be reduced from 33 metres to

prohibit any motor vehicle from proceeding on Gracefield Gardens

- between its junction with the A23 Streatham High Road and a point 12 metres west of the extended eastern building line of Nos. I to 3 Astoria Parade, Streatham High Road.
- 3. The roads which would be affected by the Orders are the A23 GLA Roads and Side Roads – Streatham High Road in the London Borough of Lambeth.
