

## LICENSING ACT 2003

### Full Variation of a Premises Licence

Notice is hereby given that UGS BELGRAVIA RESTAURANTS LTD has applied to the City of Westminster on 09/04/2020 to vary the premises licence for 18A Ebury St, SW1W 0LU.

The proposed variation is to vary the licence in respect to include the sale by retail of alcohol for consumption off the premises between 11am to 10:30pm

Any person who wishes to make a representation in relation to this application must give notice in writing of his/her representation by 07/05/2020 (28 days the day after the application is received by the licensing department) stating the grounds for making said representation to: Licensing Service, Westminster City Hall, 64 Victoria Street, London SW1E 5QP. The public register where applications are available to be viewed by members of the public can be accessed online by visiting at [www.westminster.gov.uk/Licensing](http://www.westminster.gov.uk/Licensing) and following the link to the public register.

The Licensing Authority must receive representations by the date given above. The Licensing Authority will have regard to any such representation in considering the application. It is an offence, under section 158 of the Licensing Act 2003, to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in or in connection with an application for premises licence and the maximum fine on being convicted of such an offence is £5000.
