ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14 TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – WANDSWORTH ROAD

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that to enable telecommunication works involving the operation of a crane to be carried out safely, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily ban vehicles from entering that length of Wandsworth Road which lies between the eastern kerb-lines of Cedars Road and Queenstown Road and a point 6 metres south-west of the south-western kerb-line of Victoria Rise (this would have the effect of preventing vehicles from entering or leaving Willard Street, at its junction with Wandsworth Road.

2. The road closure would only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by the placing of the appropriate traffic signs.

3. Alternative routes for affected vehicles would be available via (a) Cedars Road, Clapham Common North Side and The Chase and vice versa; (b) Queenstown Road, Silverthorne Road and Wandsworth Road; (c) Wandsworth Road, Union Road, Clapham Road, Clapham High Street, Clapham Common South Side, Long Road, Clapham Common North Side and Cedars Road; and (d) Wandsworth Road, Silverthorne Road, Broughton Street, Queenstown Road, Battersea Park Road, Falcon Road and Lavender Hill.

4. The Order would come into force on 7th June 2020 and would continue for a maximum duration of 6 months or until the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. In practice, it is anticipated that the Order would only have effect on 7th and 14th June 2020, but if the works cannot be carried out or be completed on those dates as a result of the Council's continued response to the Public Health restrictions on movement, exercise and social distancing in connection to the Covid 19 pandemic, then the Order may have effect on subsequent days or dates within the maximum duration of 6 months.
