

## **LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH**

### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14 TEMPORARY BAN ON MOTOR VEHICLES USING LARKHALL RISE AS A THROUGH ROUTE AT THE BRIDGE OVER THE RAILWAY AND SUSPENSION OF CYCLE LANES**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that because of a likelihood of danger to the public due to an increase in pedestrians and pedal cyclists using Larkhall Rise, following restrictions relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily:-

- (a) ban motor vehicles proceeding in a north-easterly direction in the part of Larkhall Rise that lies south-west of the north-eastern side of Edgeley Road from proceeding past the north-eastern side of Edgeley Road and across the bridge over the railway; and
- (b) suspend the cycle lanes on both sides of the part of Larkhall Rise that comprises the bridge over the railway and allow pedal cycles to use the middle of the carriageway of that part of Larkhall Rise (where motor vehicles would be banned) instead.

2. Alternative routes for vehicles affected by the restriction described in paragraph 1(a) above would be available via adjacent routes.

3. The temporary restrictions would enable parts of the carriageway of Larkhall Rise, where it comprises the bridge over the railway, to be sectioned off and made available to pedestrians.

4. The Order would come into force on 21st September 2020 and it would continue for a maximum duration of 18 months.
