

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

Notice is given that the Applicant, AEG Presents Limited, has applied to the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham for a new Premises Licence for **Olympia Music Hall, Olympia Exhibition Centre, Hammersmith Road, London, W14 8UX [subsequent to the Provisional Statement granted for these 'Premises' on 29 May 2024].**

The proposed licensable activities (and hours) for the new Licence replicate those set out in the Provisional Statement namely: Performance of Plays; Exhibition of Films; Indoor Sporting events; Boxing and Wrestling, Performance of Live Music; Playing of Recorded Music; Performances of Dance & Entertainment Similar to Music or Dance, and the Sale of Alcohol ('on' premises only) - Mondays to Sundays between 10:00 to 22:45. The Premises will be open to public: Mondays to Sundays 08:00 to 23:00. Limited extension of hours (with Late Night Refreshment included from 23:00) annually on New Year's Eve to extend licensable activities to 02:00 on New Year's Day (with closure by 02:30). Licence Conditions substantially replicating those on the Provisional Statement are offered in support of this new Licence Application.

Any notice should specify the grounds of opposition or support, with reference to the Licensing Objectives. Persons objecting to the grant of a licence must be prepared to attend in person at a Licensing Authority hearing. NB: Any objection will form part of the Committee Report and forwarded to the Applicant. Please inform the Licensing Authority if you have a valid reason for your personal details to be removed.

It is an offence to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in connection with an application. Persons will be liable on summary conviction to an unlimited fine.
